NuForce Aluminum Earbuds vs. Apple EarPods

I was given the chance to try the <u>NE750M</u> (\$99) earbuds from NuForce. These earbuds are a big step up from the free "EarPods" that ship with your iPhone or iPod. For starters, the earpiece component is CNC-milled from aircraft-grade aluminum. This makes them more durable than the plastic earbuds from Apple, and they still manage to be lightweight. This is important if you're going to be listening to music for a long time.

But the NE750M earbuds are not just for music. Thanks to the included inline microphone, you can make and take phone calls and interact with Siri. When you are listening to music, if you are "all about that bass" as I am, then you too will appreciate the NE750M's specific attention to bass with their Ultra Wide Band (UWB) Driver.



I hate when my earbuds get tangled, so I liked that the textured cord keeps it relatively tangle-free. I found the NE750M earbuds to be quite stylish, with a matte black finish and a subtle hint of red near the ears. NuForce includes small, medium, and large silicone earpieces so everyone should be able to find the perfect fit.
